# WELCOME TO OUR MONTHLY ROUND-UP SEPTEMBER EDITION

In September, we continued to work for every human. In Bangladesh, we distributed emergency response kits following the devastating floods. In Gaza, we provided hot meals and food parcels, having distributed two million hot meals since March, alongside the incredible efforts of our mobile clinics and water distribution programmes. In response to the crisis in Lebanon, we distributed food parcels as an emergency measure.

In Pakistan, we supported education by participating in a national literacy walk and nearly completing a school for girls, while also providing sewing machines and poultry farms to help families establish sustainable livelihoods. In Senegal, we dug wells in rural villages to ensure access to clean water.

In Somalia, our cataract surgery campaign helped restore sight to many individuals.

We provided non-food items and hygiene kits in Sudan to families affected by the floods and ongoing conflict. In Syria, our mobile clinics, Al Imaan Hospital, and Al Zohoor health centre continued to deliver vital medical care, vaccinating children and responding to the scabies epidemic in displacement camps. We are also supporting long-term efforts in Syria by building a school in Al Zohoor and aiding local farmers with wheat seeds while distributing food bundles. In Yemen, we delivered new medical equipment to the Cancer Centre and provided orphans with back-to-school kits.

# BANGLADESH



## EMERGENCY RESPONSE



Human Appeal distributed **800** emergency response kits in the upazila of Dagan Bhuiyan, providing families with easy-to-cook food items and essential hygiene products.

## FOOD SECURITY



We distributed **645,485** hot meals in Gaza, ensuring thousands of families had access to warm and nutritious food.

We reached our target of distributing a second million hot meals in Gaza in September.

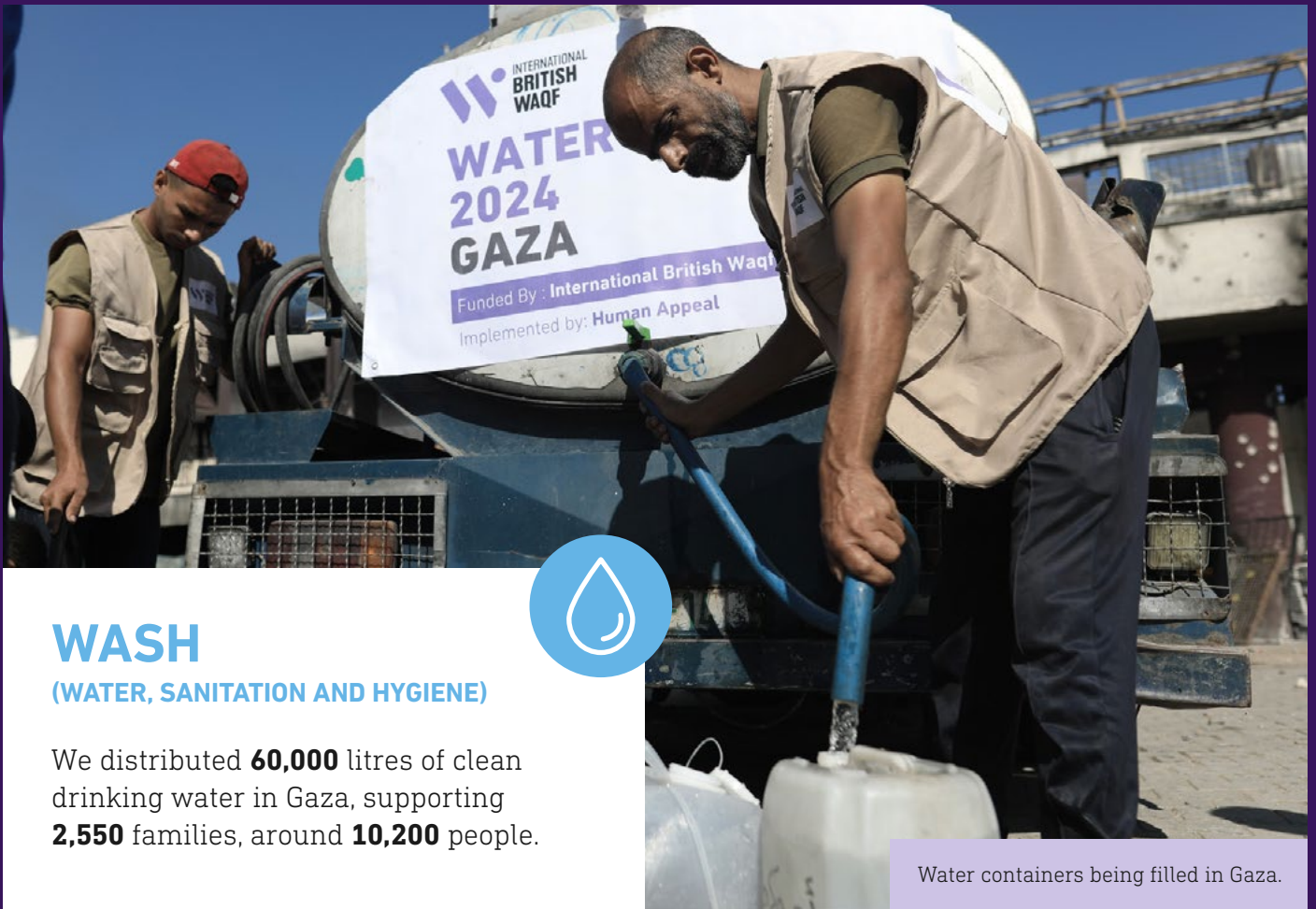
## FOOD SECURITY



We distributed **9,951** food parcels in Gaza, each containing essential food items such as rice, sugar, salt, macaroni, jam, and other ingredients.

We distributed **60,000** litres of clean drinking water in Gaza, supporting **2,550** families, around **10,200** people.

# LEBANON



## EMERGENCY RESPONSE



Following attacks in Lebanon, Human Appeal distributed **56** food parcels containing items such as canned meat to families in Saida.

## EDUCATION



Human Appeal Pakistan participated in the literacy walk organised by the National Commission for Human Development and UNESCO, highlighting the importance of education for millions of out-of-school children around the world on International Literacy Day.

## LIVELIHOODS

We distributed **86** sewing machines to women in the districts of Rahim Yar Khan and Faisalabad, and established **11** poultry farms in Faisalabad, each with **30** chickens, to ensure sustainable livelihoods.

## EDUCATION

Human Appeal has nearly finished rebuilding the girls' secondary school in Chitratopi, completing three buildings and ensuring that **14** classrooms are available. The painting is almost complete, and soon female students in the area will be able to learn in a safe and secure environment.

## LIVELIHOODS

Human Appeal conducted a three-day training course on honeybee farming for **54** people in the Bagh district of Kashmir and provided each trainee with four starter hives and the necessary equipment to establish a honeybee farm.

# SENEGAL

## WASH

(WATER, SANITATION AND HYGIENE)

We dug wells in **10** rural villages in Senegal, collaborating with Togo Wells to provide them with a sustainable source of clean water.

## HEALTH



Our cataract surgery campaign in Somalia, in collaboration with Green Lane Mosque (GLM), helped **381** patients receive cataract surgeries and provided treatment for various other eye health issues to **2,705** patients, improving their vision and overall health.

# SUDAN

## WASH

(WATER, SANITATION AND HYGIENE)



Human Appeal has provided **5,900** families in Sudan with non-food item (NFI) kits since the flooding began. Each kit contains materials to assist displaced families with their needs while sheltering from the disaster, including tarpaulins, blankets, mattresses, mosquito nets, kitchen sets, and solar-powered lamps.

## WASH

(WATER, SANITATION AND HYGIENE)



Human Appeal distributed **500** NFI and hygiene kits in Northern and Qadarif States, helping families to stay clean and healthy.

# SYRIA

## HEALTH



In August, our mobile clinic provided medical assistance to **2,004** people in northwest Syria. They benefited from services including a general physician, a pharmacy providing free medicine, a community health worker treating cases of malnutrition, and a gynaecology clinic.

## HEALTH



The health centre located in Al-Zohoor village received **4,921** patients over the course of August, many of whom took advantage of the paediatric and gynaecological clinics available in the centre.

## HEALTH



Over the course of September, Al Imaan Hospital provided medical care to **6,103** patients, many of whom benefited from specialised gynaecological and paediatric care.

## HEALTH



Human Appeal's vaccine team is providing free vaccinations to children in northwest Syria, including vaccinations against polio, measles, rickets, smallpox, and other potentially life-threatening diseases. Over the course of September, they vaccinated around **2,218** children.

## EDUCATION



The school building in Al Zohoor has been completed, with solar panels installed, walls painted and the courtyard paved. The classrooms are now filled with tables and chairs, and it is ready to receive students.

## FOOD SECURITY



Human Appeal is distributing **7,604** bundles of bread each day in northwest Syria, aiming to distribute a total of **228,120** bundles to families in hardship within the displacement camps located in the Afrin and Jandairis regions. This initiative will support approximately **3,802** families.

## FOOD SECURITY / LIVELIHOODS

Human Appeal supported local farmers in the northwest of Syria, providing **106** farmers with 200kg of wheat seeds each to reduce the costs farmers face during planting season.



## HEALTH



Our Syria team is continuing efforts to limit the spread of scabies in the Harbanoush and Al-Iga displacement camps by distributing **200** hygiene kits and conducting awareness sessions with a specialist doctor to educate people about its causes and how to prevent its spread through personal hygiene.



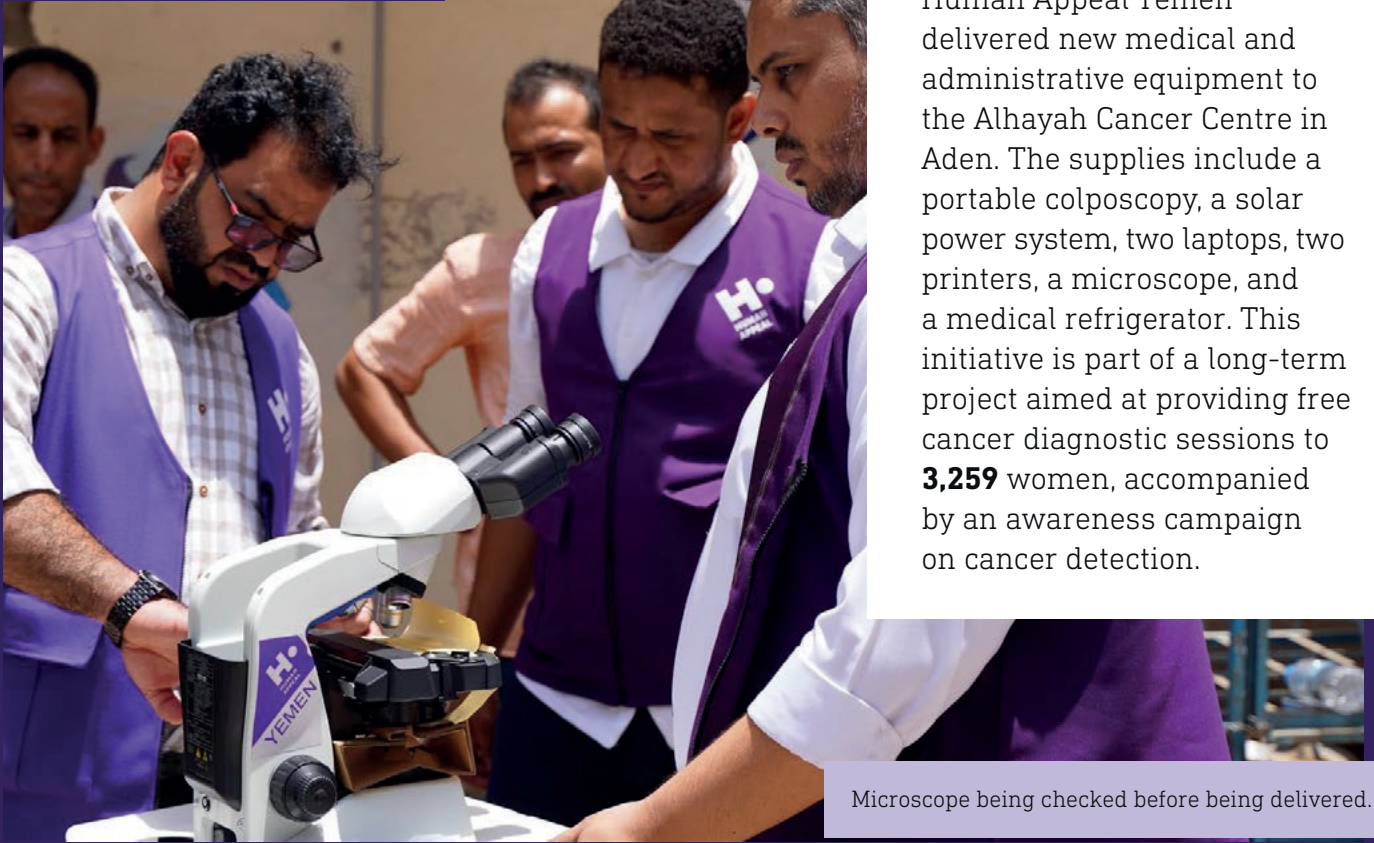

# YEMEN

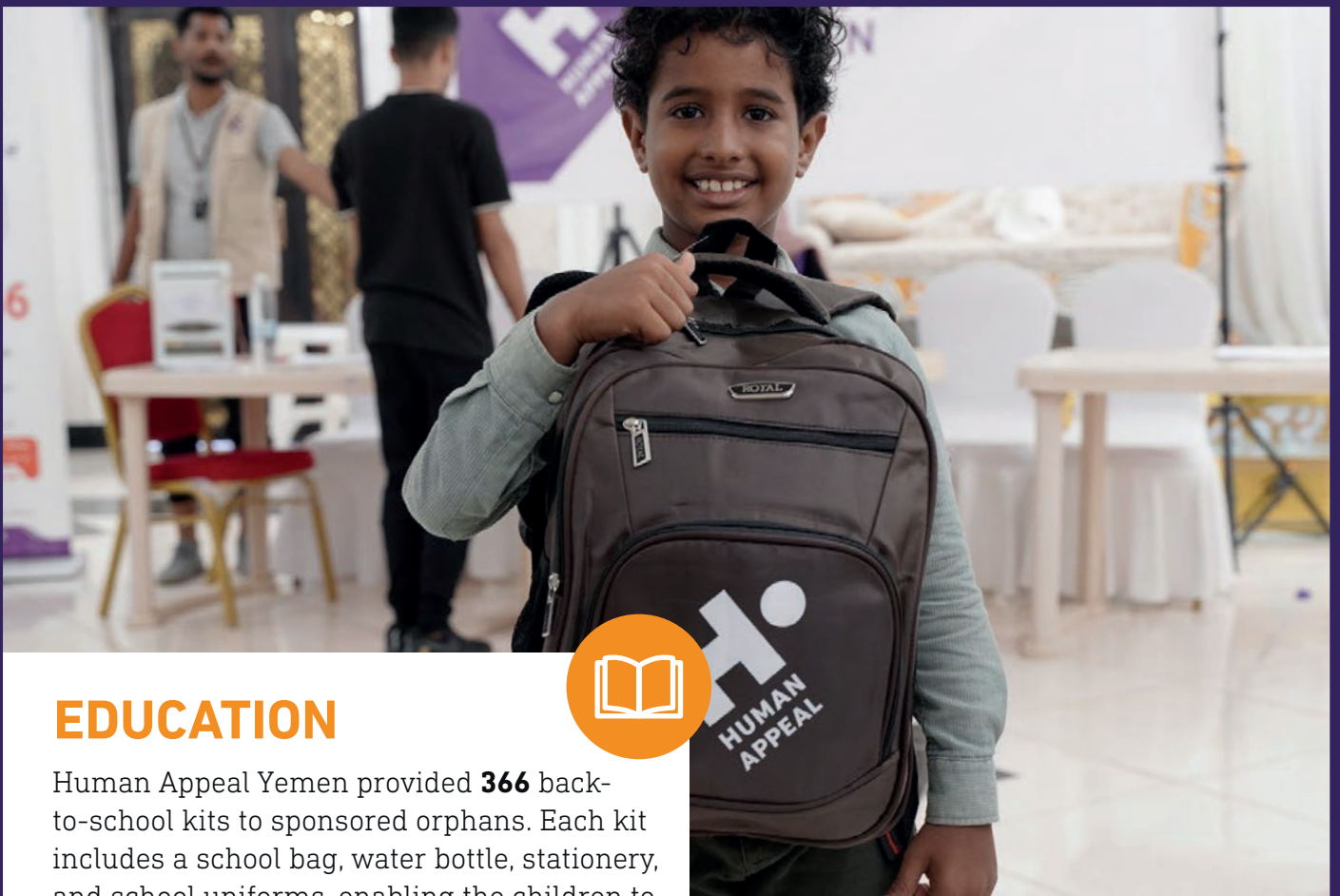
## HEALTH



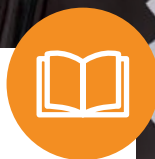
Human Appeal Yemen delivered new medical and administrative equipment to the Alhayah Cancer Centre in Aden. The supplies include a portable colposcopy, a solar power system, two laptops, two printers, a microscope, and a medical refrigerator. This initiative is part of a long-term project aimed at providing free cancer diagnostic sessions to **3,259** women, accompanied by an awareness campaign on cancer detection.

## EDUCATION



Human Appeal Yemen provided **366** back-to-school kits to sponsored orphans. Each kit includes a school bag, water bottle, stationery, and school uniforms, enabling the children to learn with confidence.
